SIGNED VETERAN LEGISLATION

What does it mean for Delaware Veterans?



House Bill 214

The Disabled Veterans Property Tax Relief and Education Fund means school districts are authorized to create a credit against school taxes for up to the full amount of school tax liability for property owned by a veteran with a 100% disability rating who is domiciled in this state. The full amount of such credit will be reimbursed by a transfer from the State's General Fund to the County Receiver for distribution to such school districts.

Senate Bill 117

This bill allows schools and school districts to submit an application to the Department of Education to have a school designated as a Purple Star School.

"Saluting Branches"

– Arborist Day of Service

MILLSBORO, Del. — Dozens of arborists and professionals from three Delaware tree care companies volunteered for the 7th Annual "Saluting Branches" event by devoting a day to trimming, shaping, and removing hazardous trees from the Delaware Veterans Memorial Cemetery in Millsboro. The Delaware site was one of 40 sites throughout the United States that participated in the event, which attracted more than 3,000 volunteers. Workers from Tri-State Tree Care, Complete Tree Care, and Cypress Tree Care spent their entire day as a way to pay tribute to the veterans and their service.

Jay Ashby, who runs Cypress Tree Care and also serves as Chair of Delaware's Community Forestry Council, called it a "Great day of service for our resting veterans."

Joe Shoup from Cypress Tree Care was glad to be back after participating in 2019 but having last year's event canceled due to COVID-19.

The "Rusty Eagles" landed in Dover



Anyone who has seen a Vietnam War movie is familiar with the "whop, whop," of UH-1 "Huey" helicopters swooping to rescue wounded soldiers amid clouds of dust and gunfire. Four-man Dustoff crews flew day and night in all weather, in mountains and valleys, often under fire. Credited with saving some 900,000 lives during Vietnam, including several members of Chapter 850. Dustoff crews had a casualty rate greater than 30 percent with 214 killed, 925 wounded, and 199 helicopters lost. They have been nominated for a Congressional Gold Medal. After an initial visit in 2017, "Rusty Eagle" crews from 22 states convened in Dover between September 21-26 for their annual reunion. They were honored by Kent County Chapter 850, Vietnam Veterans of America, in a number of events throughout the week, including a dinner at Dover's Modern Maturity Center; bus trips to the Vietnam Wall in D.C., and Ft. Miles in Lewes; and a special ceremony at the Veterans Memorial Park in Dover on Saturday, September 25. The ceremony included the unveiling of 102 memorial bricks at the park in memory of some of those lost. The keynote speaker at the event was Vietnam nurse Rhona Prescott who shared her respects and memories of her medevac brothers who delivered their wounded to her at field hospital sites. Veterans Coalition

engages with Dept. of Correction for incarcerated veterans

The Delaware Veterans Coalition is engaged with the Delaware Department of Correction to connect with incarcerated veterans. The effort began in late 2019 with a letter from a Vietnamera veteran in the James T. Vaughn Correctional Facility in Smyrna that was followed with visits to the veteran over a period of months. The veteran was paroled nearly a year ago but chose to remain involved with reaching out to his fellow veterans in conjunction with the Coalition, according to Coalition President Dave Skocik.

Several meetings have taken place, the latest on September 9, with DOC Commissioner Monroe B. Hudson to discuss ways to increase informational contacts and material to incarcerated veterans to make them aware of benefits they've earned through their service, many of which will be available upon their release. The meeting included representatives of the Veterans Coalition; Delaware Veterans Court; the Legislature; the Commission of Veterans Affairs, and the Veterans Administration. Additional meetings are scheduled.

Friends Gearing up for Annual Trust Dinner

The Friends of Delaware Veterans will host its annual Black Tie Optional fundraising dinner in conjunction with Veterans Day to benefit the Delaware Veterans Trust Fund on Saturday, November 13, from 6 to 9 p.m. at Dover's Modern Maturity Center.

"The dinner was canceled in last year due to Covid, but we're looking forward to a grand event this year," said Dave Skocik, Friends president.

The Delaware Veterans Trust Fund was signed into law in 2013 under the Commission of Veterans Affairs. It provides emergency financial assistance to honorably discharged veterans residing in Delaware. It has stopped cutoff of utilities, repossessions of vehicles, provided repairs for housing and other emergency grants. All grants go directly to creditors.

The Friends was established in 2014 as the fundraising arm of the Veterans Trust Fund. Its board members are all veterans who work pro bono throughout the year in conjunction with the Commission. All contributions are tax deductible.

Dinner tickets will remain \$100 and include a plated meal, entertainment, a keynote speaker, an auction and a great deal of comradery, according to Friends Vice President Paul Davis.



The VA Health Chat app provides easy online access for Veterans enrolled with Wilmington VA Medical Center and its Community Based Outpatient Clinics in Kent and Sussex Counties to chat with VA staff with minor health questions.

Use VA Health Chat for immediate answers when you:

- ★ Need medical advice for a minor injury or illness.
- → Feel ill and unsure about going to an ER or clinic.
- → Have questions about your medications or need a refill.
- ✦ Have questions about your consults.
- ★ Looking for results of lab or imaging tests.

Ending Veteran Homelessness, Increasing Access to Affordable Housing

The COVID-19 pandemic has highlighted a need for Veteran housing in America. According to the Department of Housing and Urban Development's 2020 Annual Homeless Assessment Report (AHAR).

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) and Housing and Urban Development (HUD) are committed in its partnership in a mission of ending Veteran homelessness by:

- → Make ending Veteran homelessness a top priority
- → Lead with an evidence-based housing first approach
- Reach underserved Veterans
- **★** Ensure the delivery of quality supportive services
- → Increase the supply of and access to affordable housing

Increase the Supply of and Access to Affordable Housing

There is a low inventory of available housing for at-risk Veterans in our area, and landlords are not accepting <u>HUD-VASH (VA Supportive Housing) Program</u> vouchers at previous rates. This is leading to a housing and health crisis for vulnerable Veterans.

"Housing is an essential part of health care. Reliable housing leads to an increase in access to health care services," said Vince Kane, Director, Wilmington VA Medical Center. "When Veterans have stable housing, we can more easily connect with them and ensure they are receiving the health care services they need. Our goal is to work with private landlords to educate and encourage them to accept HUD-VASH vouchers to house our nation's Veterans. Together, we can end Veteran homelessness."

As part of this education effort, Wilmington VA Medical Center will be holding a virtual landlord resource fair in the coming months.


